## Spiritual Life at Convention

#### 1. Convention theme - Come, listen, live

The Convention of General Synod theme is based on Isaiah 55:3 '...come to me, listen, that you may live.'

**COME** – come to Jesus and there you will see how much God loves you and how much he paid to redeem you. His cross is your beginning and your end. Everything in your life and death is anchored and finds its meaning there. Here is where you come to be reborn – to repent, to lay down your burdens. Here you receive new life – forgiveness, renewal and refreshment.

**LISTEN** – pause at the cross, be still, hear the timeless God speak to you from the cross. Hear his voice in the crosses of your own life and in the life of the church. Lay aside the load you carry, all the voices demanding your attention, even those of your own making. Here at the cross, listen to God and you will receive everything you need ...

... that you may **LIVE**. Life truly comes when we live through the cross of Christ, in the power of his death, resurrection and ascension. Jesus is where God meets us on earth, and we know abundant life in him, life marked by the fruits of the Spirit and life eternal with him forever.

#### 2. Logo explanation

The cross is central and prominent. Lutheran teaching always points to and revolves Jesus. Our teaching is interpreted by his cross. It's the lens through which we view the world. The cross shapes our relationships with God and with others.

The circle represents a how all creation finds its centre and its purpose in Jesus.

The background landscape mosaic places the cross in the context of the world in which we live, and our place and purpose in it.

The text (come, listen, live) is embedded around the cross, circling it in a continuous, neverending movement. The invitation of God to come, listen and live at the foot of the cross is a lifetime calling.

#### 3. Chaplain program

The in-person sessions of the 20<sup>th</sup> Regular Convention of General Synod continued a program with floor and prayer chaplains, both ordained and lay, were available to provide pastoral care and spiritual support for delegates and visitors.

#### 4. Convention Dinner

The convention dinner was host by the Melbourne Convention Centre and celebrated the Lutheran Laypeople's League (LLL) Centenary Celebration. The guest speaker was Rev Dr James Winderlich, Australian Lutheran College Principal.

#### Synod Offering

The 2021 Synod offering of \$19,097.60 was received for the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Papua New Guinea, a partner church of the LCANZ. The offering will support in-service training of pastors in the ELCPNG so that they may be strengthened in their ministry of the gospel.

The 2023 Synod offering of \$34,098.66 was received and will be directed to Finke River Mission for assistance in printing Lutheran Hymnals and Songbooks in language.

LCA Secretary Dr Nigel Long introduced the rules for transacting business (see Book of Reports Addendum page 10), guidelines for prayer and chaplaincy including the introduction of the Synod Chaplaincy Team. A video on respectful dialogue was played for the delegates.

Mr Fred Kleinschmidt (legal consultant appointed by General Church Board to provide advice on procedural matters) was introduced as a consultant to Synod.

#### Constitutions

#### 4–14 Dissolution Clause: Model Constitution of Districts (Agenda 2.1.6.7)

**20–23 RESOLVED** that **ARTICLE 11. DISSOLUTION** of the By-laws of the Church, Constitution of the Districts, be amended to add the following words

(words to be deleted - strike through; words to be added - **bold**):

## Article 11. DISSOLUTION

- 11.1 Changes to the prescribed geographical area of the District, dissolution of the District, or an amalgamation of the District with one or more other Districts or with the Church or changes to the legislative or governance structure of the Church affecting the District shall be determined according to the procedure set out in this article.
- 11.2 Action initiated by the Church

- 11.2.1 For any action referred to in the preceding clause 11.1 initiated by the Church, the General Church Board, in consultation with the District Church Council and its Synod, shall outline the reasons, purposes and procedure for such a proposal and make a recommendation to the District Synod. Upon an in principle agreement, the matter shall proceed to a General Synod for approval.
- 11.2.2 Any decision for any action referred to in the preceding clause 11.1 shall be made by the Church according to the following procedure:
  - Written Anotice of a motion specifying such action shall be given to the delegates of the General Synod.
  - 11.2.2.2 At least thirty [30] days written notice of a General Synod, specifying such action as a special motion, shall be given to the delegates of the General Synod.
  - The motion must be presented at a duly constituted General Synod and shall require a majority of **not less than** three-quarters [3/4] of all the registered delegates of the General Synod.
- Once a decision has been determined by the Church according to the preceding clause 11.2.2 it shall be communicated to the District which shall then take the following action:
  - 11.2.3.1 **Written An**otice of a motion specifying the action shall be given to the delegates of the District Synod.
  - 11.2.3.2 At least thirty [30] days written notice of a District Synod, specifying the action to be taken as a special motion, shall be given to the delegates of the District Synod.
  - 11.2.3.3 The motion must be presented at a duly constituted District Synod and shall require a majority of **not less than** three-quarters [3/4] of all the registered delegates of the District Synod.
  - 11.2.3.4 The special resolution shall be submitted to the General Church Board.
- 11.3 Action initiated by the District
  - 11.3.1 For any action referred to in the preceding clause 11.1 initiated by the District, the District shall outline the reasons, purposes and procedure for such a proposal to the General Church Board for consultation prior to presentation to the District Synod.
  - Following such consultation as described in the preceding clause 11.3.1, any outline of the reasons and purposes for dissolution shall be made by the District according to the following procedure:
    - 11.3.2.1 **Written An**otice of a motion specifying the action shall be given to the delegates of the District Synod.
    - 11.3.2.2 At least thirty [30] days written notice of a District Synod, specifying such action as a special motion, shall be given to the delegates of the District Synod.
    - 11.3.2.3 The motion must be presented at a duly constituted District Synod and shall require a majority of **not less than** three-quarters [3/4] of all the registered delegates of the District Synod.
    - 11.3.2.4 The special resolution shall be submitted to the General Church Board.
  - 11.3.3 Upon agreement, the General Church Board, subject to the provisions in the Constitution of the Church, Article 9.2, shall submit the proposal to a General Synod for approval according to the procedure in the preceding clause 11.2.2.
- 11.4 Any recommendation or motion for dissolution of the District must address the transferring of the surplus assets of the District to either the Church or another district of the Church.
- 11.5 The District Synod shall take all steps required to implement the special resolution for action under this clause, including the making of changes required in respect of incorporation under the Act and/or other relevant legislation.

#### 4–15 Objects: Model Constitution of Districts (Agenda 2.1.6.8)

**20–24 RESOLVED** that **Article 3. OBJECTS** of the Model Constitution for a District in the By-laws of the Church, be amended to revise clause 3.1.14:

(words to be deleted - strike through; words to be added - **bold**):

3.1.14 take such action as is necessary for the protection of the congregations, pastors, teachers and other church workers in the performance of their duties and the maintenance of their rights.

- 3.1.14 maintain and promote a culture of care in all areas of the Church and its activities, so that all people, especially the vulnerable such as children and the aged, are protected against any form of spiritual, emotional, physical and sexual abuse by ensuring that
  - 3.1.14.1 appropriate governance and leadership structures are in place;
  - 3.1.14.2 policies and procedures are appropriately prescribed;
  - 3.1.14.3 a culture of safety and care for children and all people is actively encouraged and practiced; and
  - 3.1.14.4 the well-being of congregations, pastors, teachers and other church workers in the performance of their duties and the maintenance of their rights is supported and promoted.

A proposal to amend Article 3.1.14.4 to 'Take such action as necessary for the protection of the congregations, church members, pastors, teachers, and other church workers in the performance of their duties and the maintenance of their rights' was **lost**.

# 4–16 Withdrawal from Membership clauses: Lutheran Church of Australian Inc (Agenda 2.1.6.9)

**20–25 RESOLVED** that in the Constitution and By-laws of the Church, the following changes be made (words to be deleted - strike through; words to be added - **bold**):

Article 13.2

Notice of any such motion to amend, alter, add to or repeal any of the rules shall be given on the agenda of the convention, and any motion to amend, alter, add or repeal shall require a two thirds majority of not less than two-thirds [2/3] of all the delegates registered at the convention.

#### Section 4.3

#### Withdrawal From Membership

- 4.3 A congregation may withdraw from membership in the Church by adopting the following procedure:
  - 4.3.1 The resolution of a congregation indicating the desire to withdraw must be adopted at a legally constituted meeting of the congregation and shall require a majority of **not less than** two-thirds **[2/3]** of all the voting members of the congregation, and shall be submitted to the Bishop of the District within fourteen [14] days of adoption.
  - 4.3.2 The Bishop of the District or the Bishop's appointed representative shall negotiate with the congregation for at least ninety [90] days after receipt of the resolution.
  - 4.3.3 After such negotiation, the formal and final vote shall be taken at a legally constituted meeting of the congregation, the purpose of which has been published and at which the Bishop of the District or the Bishop's representative shall be present.
  - 4.3.4 The final motion to withdraw shall require a majority of **not less than** two-thirds **[2/3]** of all the voting members of the congregation. A copy of the resolution shall be forwarded to the Bishop of the District, and upon its receipt the membership of the congregation in the Church shall terminate. The Bishop shall forward notice of withdrawal to the Secretary of the Church, who shall publish it in the official publication of the Church.

#### Section 7.3.28.3

7.3.28.3 For a resolution on a matter of doctrine to be deemed to be the official position of the Church it shall require a two thirds majority of not less than two-thirds [2/3] of all the registered delegates at the convention.

#### **Section 7.3.29**

7.3.29 Any of the By-laws in Section 7.3 may, if the need arises, be suspended in respect to any business of the convention, by a two thirds majority of not less than two-thirds [2/3] of those delegates present.

# 4–17 Withdrawal from Membership clauses: Model Constitution of the Districts (Agenda 2.1.6.10)

**20–26 RESOLVED** that in the Constitution and By-laws of the Church, Constitutions of the Districts, the following changes be made (words to be deleted - strike through; words to be added - **bold**):

#### Article 13.2

Notice of any motion to amend, alter, add to or repeal any of the rules shall be given on the agenda of the convention, and any such motion shall require a two-thirds majority of not less than two-thirds [2/3] of all the registered delegates at the convention, unless the motion relates to an amendment, alteration, addition or repeal already approved or recommended by General Synod or General Church Board of the Church, in which case the motion shall require a majority of those voting.

#### Section 4.3

#### Withdrawal from Membership

- 4.3 A congregation may withdraw from membership in the Church by adopting the following procedure:
  - 4.3.1 The resolution of a congregation indicating the desire to withdraw must be adopted at a legally constituted meeting of the congregation by a two-thirds majority of not less than two-thirds [2/3] of all the voting members of the Congregation, and shall be submitted to the Bishop of the District within fourteen [14] days of adoption.
  - 4.3.2 The Bishop of the District or the Bishop's appointed representative shall negotiate with the congregation for at least ninety [90] days after receipt of the resolution.
  - 4.3.3 After such negotiation the formal and final vote shall be taken at a legally constituted meeting of the congregation, the purpose of which has been published and at which the Bishop of the District or the Bishop's representative shall be present.
  - 4.3.4 The final motion to withdraw shall require a majority of **not less than** two-thirds **[2/3]** of all the voting members of the Congregation. If it is resolved in the affirmative, a copy of the resolution shall be forwarded to the Bishop of the District, and upon its receipt the membership of the congregation in the Church shall terminate. The Bishop shall forward notice of withdrawal to the Secretary of the Church, who shall publish it in the official publication of the Church.

#### <u>Section 7.3.29</u>

7.3.29 Any of the By-laws in Section 7.3 may, if the need arises, be suspended in respect to any business of the convention by a two-thirds majority of not less than two-thirds [2/3] of those delegates present.

# 4–18 Membership and Dissolution clauses: Model Constitution of Congregations (Agenda 2.1.6.11)

**20–27 RESOLVED** that in the Model Constitution for a Congregation the following changes be made (words to be deleted - strike through; words to be added - **bold**):

#### **ARTICLE 11. DISSOLUTION**

- 11.1 A special resolution is required if it is proposed that the Congregation dissolve and any such resolution for dissolution shall be made according to the following procedure:
  - 11.1.1 Written notice of a motion to dissolve the Congregation shall be given to the members of the Congregation.
  - 11.1.2 The motion shall be presented to the Congregation only after the Bishop of the District has been consulted.
  - 11.1.3 At least thirty [30] days written notice of a meeting, specifying the intention to dissolve as a special motion, shall be given to all the voting members of the Congregation.
  - 11.1.4 The motion shall require a majority of **not less than** three-quarters [3/4] of all the voting members of the Congregation for determination at a general meeting.

#### ARTICLE 13. ALTERATIONS TO THE CONSTITUTION

13.1 The Congregation may resolve, by a resolution requiring at least a two-thirds majority of not less than two-thirds [2/3] of the members present, to amend, alter, add to or repeal its Constitution, including changing the name of the Congregation, except as hereinafter provided in the following clause 13.4 and subject to the preceding clause 3.1.4.

#### 4–19 Membership and Dissolution clauses: Model Constitution of Parishes (Agenda 2.1.6.12)

**20–28 RESOLVED** that in the Model Constitution for a Parish the following changes be made (words to be deleted - strike through; words to be added - **bold**):

#### **ARTICLE 5. MEMBERSHIP**

5.1 The Parish shall consist of the following congregations and others admitted according to the procedure in the following clause 5.2 and the voting members of member-congregations shall be the voting members of the Parish:

- 5.1.1 (Names of congregations inserted here)
- 5.2 Any other congregation which is a member of both the Church and the District may apply for membership in the Parish and shall require a two-thirds [2/3] majority of not less than two-thirds [2/3] of those voting members present at a duly constituted meeting of the Parish provided that at least one [1] calendar month's notice of application for such membership shall have been given to all member-congregations of the Parish.

#### **ARTICLE 11. DISSOLUTION**

- 11.1 A special resolution is required if it is proposed that the Parish dissolve and any such resolution for dissolution shall be made according to the following procedure:
  - 11.1.1 Written notice of a motion to dissolve the Parish shall be given to the member-congregations of the Parish.
  - 11.1.2 The motion shall be presented to the member-congregations only after the Bishop of the District has been consulted.
  - 11.1.3 At least thirty [30] days written notice of a meeting, specifying the intention to dissolve as a special motion, shall be given to all the voting members of the Parish.
  - 11.1.4 The motion shall require a majority of **not less than** three-quarters [3/4] of all the voting members of the Parish for determination at a general meeting.

#### ARTICLE 13. ALTERATIONS TO THE CONSTITUTION

13.1 The Parish may resolve, by a resolution requiring at least a two-thirds majority of not less than two-thirds [2/3] of the members present, amend, alter, add to or repeal its Constitution, including changing the name of the Parish, except as hereinafter provided in the following clause 13.4 and subject to the preceding clause 3.1.4.

## Doctrine and Theology

#### 4-20 Procedural acceptance of new proposals and reports (Agenda 2.2.10)

**20–29 RESOLVED** that General Synod accept amended proposals submitted by St Pauls' Box Hill and the LCA Queensland District under 7.3.1 2 of the LCA Bylaws as the proposals for items 2.2.4 and 2.2.9 respectively on ordination for debate before the 20<sup>th</sup> Regular Convention.

Bishop Paul Smith addressed a perceived conflict of interest regarding his wife's theological study and consideration of ordained ministry. Bishop Paul vacated the chair for the General Synod to confirm its confidence in him serving as chair for the proposals on ordination. Assistant Bishop, Rev Neville Otto, transacted the vote of confidence.

The vote of confidence in Bishop Paul Smith was carried. Bishop Paul Smith return to the chair.

Ben Gargett, Chair of St Paul's Box Hill, presented the proposal to Synod.

  women can be ordained according to Holy Scripture and the Lutheran
  confessions, and
- 2. For the sake of the gospel and the mission of God that we share in the LCANZ, that Theses of Agreement (T.A.) 6.11 be removed from the Theses of Agreement, and
- 3. For peace and unity, the LCA allows for two practices in the office of the ministry, being male only ordination and the ordination of both men and women effective from 4 February 2024, and

4. The constitution of the LCA be amended as set out below (words to be deleted – strikethrough; words to be added – **bold**) and General Church Board be authorised to make any necessary changes to the By-Laws to enact points 2 and 3.

Bishop Paul Smith adjourned the session at 12:45pm.

Debate on the proposal continued.

**Proposed amendment:** that the word "person" be changed to "men and women" as the proposed amendment to Article 5.1 of the LCA Constitution.

#### The amendment was CARRIED. The motion became:

- 5.1.1 accept and hold the Confession of the Church;
- 5.1.2 accept the Constitution and By-Laws of the Church; and
- 5.1.3 undertake to participate in the work of the Church and to promote its Objects. Such members of the ministry shall be recorded in the official Roll of Pastors.

Thirty-six (36) delegates spoke to the motion.

Chaplains Rev David Wear and Sue Westhorp led the assembly in prayer before the vote was taken.

The vote on the motion was conducted by ballot. The vote required a two-thirds majority of all registered delegates for the motion to pass. The final figures were: 203 in favour of the proposal; 169 against; 3 abstained.

The motion was LOST as the required two thirds majority of 230 was not attained.

Chaplains Rev David Wear and Sue Westhorp prayed for the synod after the vote was announced.

- a) Work through the theological, constitutional, and governance requirements to operate as one church with two different practices of ordination and establish a detailed framework through which this could be accomplished, such as establishing a geographical or non-geographical LCANZ 'District' that does so, teaches and practices the ordination of both women and men to the office of the public ministry, and
- b) Submit the fruit of this work in the form of a proposal that can be discussed and potentially endorsed by the LCANZ General Pastors Conference and Convention of General Synod 2024.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENT #1 THAT** the General Synod direct the LCANZ General Church Board and the College of Bishops to:

- a) Work through the theological, constitutional, and governance requirements to operate as one church with two different practices of ordination and establish a detailed framework through which this could be accomplished, such as one or more existing LCANZ Districts becoming Districts that teach and practice the ordination of both women and men to the office of the public ministry or by establishing a geographical or non-geographical LCANZ 'District' that does so, teaches and practices the ordination of both women and men to the office of the public ministry, and
- b) Submit the fruit of this work in the form of a proposal that can be discussed and potentially endorsed by the LCANZ General Pastors Conference and Convention of General Synod 2024.
- c) It is the expectation of this General Convention of Synod that both women and men will be ordained in a District of the LCANZ during the 2024-2027 synodical period.

The amendment was CARRIED. The amendment became the motion.

An amendment was proposed that instead of one church with two practices, have instead 'two synods, two practices, sharing assets.' The chair did not accept this amendment as using the language of two synods introduces new business.

A **point of order** was raised that the proposal already mentions two overarching synods. This is within the scope of the proposal and so cannot be considered new business. The point of order was overruled by the chair

The ruling was appealed. Bishop Paul Smith handed the chair to District Bishop David Altus to enable the Convention to debate the appeal.

The appeal was **LOST**. Bishop Paul Smith returned to the chair.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENT #2 THAT** the General Synod direct the LCANZ General Church Board and the College of Bishops to:

- a) Work through the theological, constitutional, and governance requirements to operate as one church with two different practices of ordination and establish a detailed framework through which this could be accomplished, such as one or more existing LCANZ Districts becoming Districts that teach and practice the ordination of both women and men to the office of the public ministry or by establishing a nongeographical LCANZ 'District' that does so, and
- b) Submit the fruit of this work in the form of a proposal that can be discussed <del>and potentially endorsed</del> by the LCANZ General Pastors Conference <del>and for</del> Convention of General Synod 2024.
- c) It is the expectation of this General Convention of Synod that both women and men will be ordained in a District of the LCANZ during the 2024-2027 synodical period.

Executive Office of the Church Brett Hausler and Chair of Finance Audit and Risk Committee Mel Zerner presented an updated financial report.

5–03 Explore establishment of one church with two ordination practices (Agenda 2.2.9.V2) The results from the vote on amended proposal 2.2.9 were announced. The vote required a simple majority of all the registered delegates for the motion to pass. The final figures were: 250 in favour of the proposal; 89 against; 1 abstained.

**20–30 RESOLVED THAT** the General Synod direct the LCANZ General Church Board and the College of Bishops to:

- a) Work through the theological, constitutional, and governance requirements to operate as one church with two different practices of ordination and establish a detailed framework through which this could be accomplished, such as one or more existing LCANZ Districts becoming Districts that teach and practice the ordination of both women and men to the office of the public ministry or by establishing a nongeographical LCANZ 'District' that does so, and
- b) Submit the fruit of this work in the form of a proposal that can be discussed by the LCANZ General Pastors Conference for Convention of General Synod 2024.
- c) It is the expectation of this General Convention of Synod that both women and men will be ordained in a District of the LCANZ during the 2024-2027 synodical period.

#### GCB work plan for implementation of LCAQD Proposal (Agenda 2.2.9.V2)

GCB Member Charmaine Harch spoke further to the work to be done arising from the Queensland proposal. GCB will oversee the preparation of the work on ordination issues, with transparency being a strong value and pastoral care as a primary objective. GCB recommends this work to the delegates.

#### 5-05 Offer congregations peaceful dismissal (Agenda 2.2.7)

Summer Schultz, Lay Delegate of Minyip Warracknabeal, presented the proposal. The proposal, offering congregations unable to live under the current teaching of a male-only pastorate be offered a peaceful dismissal at the Convention of Synod 2024 was LOST (see full proposal in Book of Reports).

A proposal for the matter addressed in the proposal be referred to GCB was CARRIED.

#### 5-06 Ecclesiastical Discipline (Agenda 2.1.7)

The original proposal was adopted by Synod at the online sessions in 2021.

GCB member Kim Baumeler provided a report on the Ecclesiastic Discipline Review. Ms Baumeler reported that the initial work called for and received over 80 submissions which also looked at best practices and other church processes. The work was referred to GCB with over 40 recommendations being brought back to Synod by GCB.

Passing of the recommendations and the steering committee has formed main considerations on how complaints are received, and a triage system be applied rather than the current system.

It was noted Synod has not had the chance to discuss the recommendations. Delegates were asked to refer concerns to GCB.

# 5-07 Amend clause 3.2 in Model Constitution for Congregations (Agenda 2.2.8)

Andrew Vanderwal presented the proposal from the SA-NT District.

20-31 RESOLVED THAT, General Synod replace Clause 3.2 in the model constitution for a congregation with the following: The congregation accepts the pastoral guidelines for responsible communion practice in the LCA. The pastor and congregation agree to seek the district bishop's approval for any proposal for the public proclamation of the Word in the divine service by others than those normally authorised to do so in the LCA.

Bishop Paul Smith adjourned the session at 3:00pm

#### **Business Session Six**

Session six commenced at 3:30pm. Bishop Paul Smith declared a quorum was present.

## 5–08 Formalities

The chair invited Rev Ray Pace, head teller for Convention, to advise the ratio of lay delegates to pastors delegates in attendance at the convention. This was in response to a question from the floor at the beginning of the day's proceedings seeking confirmation of the ratio.

Rev Pace advised that 206 lay delegates and 138 pastors were present at the beginning of convention. That is 59.9 percent lay delegates and 40.1 percent pastor delegates.

#### 5–11 Uniting – Lutheran Dialogue – At the Table (Agenda 14.7)

Rev Dr Stephen Haar presented the proposal.

**20–33 RESOLVED THAT** General Synod receive and adopt "At the Table: The Eucharist as an agreed statement between the Lutheran Church of Australia and the Uniting Church in Australia".
